Myalgic Encephalomyelitis, Chronic Fatigue Syndrome

WHEREAS: Myalgic Encephalomyelitis (ME), commonly known as Chronic Fatigue Syndrome (ME/CFS), is a neurological and autoimmune disease characterized by overwhelming fatigue, pain, post-exertional malaise, headaches, cardiac symptoms, immune disorders, dizziness, and balance problems; and

WHEREAS: Fibromyalgia (FM) is characterized by severe musculoskeletal pain and tenderness in many areas of the body, along with fatigue and sleep dysfunction, generalized or regional stiffness, and in some cases neurological and cognitive symptoms. This pain can become strong enough to prevent people from working or engaging in physical activities for months and even years; and

WHEREAS: Multiple Chemical Sensitivities (MCS), also called Environmental Sensitivities or Intolerances, means an unusually severe sensitivity or allergy-like reaction to different kinds of pollutants such as chemicals, perfumes and other environmental triggers; and

WHEREAS: More than 20 million individuals worldwide are afflicted by these chronic illnesses, and once diagnosed, one is often ill for years, and as many as 70 percent are disabled for life; and

WHEREAS: These illnesses affect men, women and children of all backgrounds and presently the causes are unknown.
